Voyage of a naturist artist Takir Hossain

Shahanoor Mamun, considered as one of the most talented watercolorist in the country, has a great zeal for depicting the splendor of nature, six seasons of the country, monsoon and its intrinsic beauty, placid environment, riverine life, flora and fauna, dense foliage, cloudy skies, hilly areas along the banks of Sangu river, green ambiance of Sutai river which extends from Brahmaputra river, sights of Sundarbans mangrove forest and more. He draws rural, urban, semi-urban and old parts of the city where the protagonists are very much connected with the localities. He believes in a great philosophy, that we are all part of nature, but some of us intimately studies nature with intense passion.

The exhibition's artworks were completed from October 2017 to October 2019. During the last two years, Mamun frequently went outdoors towards different locations in the country. He visited the spots first and then went off to draw their surroundings. He does not believe in replicating photographs. Rather he tries to feel the ambiances in their true essence from the core of his heart, a desire which has further motivated him to immerse himself with the ambiance of nature. At the show, the watercolorist has proved his dexterity in portraying the details of light and shadow while reflecting the 'nature at work' through torrential rain, untainted landscape, rivers with boats and quiet surrounding.

Undoubtedly, Mamun is a nature watercolorist. Besides watercolor, the artist also uses ink, charcoal, dry pastel, Chinese ink and pen. At the show titled "Stories", some new subjects have introduced a novel dimension where spectators would see the relationship of mother-son, a lying dog, a cat with a teen girl, the splendor of the monsoon. There are two of his works where

Previously he had done many works on the flowers, but the flowers of the current show has been done with the technique of using loose brush and not going to the details, particularly when it comes to the leaves and petals. He has done a little bit of experiment since technique has got more focus than the subject. Most applications of his watercolor techniques involve – the blooming watercolor method, plein air and flat wash. He has also frequently used the glazing technique. This is a watercolor technique similar to a wash and the artist has used a thin, luminous color over dry existing washes. It can be clearly perceived that Mamun has confidently applied a single loose or several loose strokes and then left them for drying.

At the show, isolation and tranquility are two vital components in Mamun's artworks. Mystifying light is really a prominent aspect in his watercolors, and the artist also wants to create a perplexing setting. Most of his figures have been created as unique characters and one can easily realize the distinctive appeal of the figures. His themes and approaches are strongly linked to physiological experiments. He has also added illusion and emotion to his works. At the show, black is the predominant aspect in most of his watercolors and drawing-based works. It has been easily comprehended that the artist has experimented with black and its mysterious tones, tenors and layers of shades. Like figures and objects, most of his colors look vibrant and eloquent. Many of his works bear indications of a great experiment done with this particular color. He has tried to grasp the



In his career, Mamun has developed an individual style chiefly for the watercolor medium. He prefers the medium firstly and foremostly for its articulateness. The medium's lucidity gives him a liberty to impart his creativity smoothly. Many of his watercolors have also been done with agile brushstrokes. He possesses the right amount of insistence and potentials necessary for transforming visuals of the world into heart-rending imagery. He draws pleasure from watercolor which enables

him to interpret his inner thriving.

Unquestionably, Mamun is a workaholic painter. Over the course of time, he has been tirelessly experimenting with subjects, spaces, tones and hues. The painter always feels being driven to explore something novel and refreshing. It breaks monotony for him and he believes art can be enriched through repeated changing of subjects. To him each subject has a special feature,

which demonstrates individual light, tone and space. He really gets inspiration and muses on the feelings imbued with the world of nature. The poetry in nature produces a surge of feelings in him, enabling him to hear and interpret the sounds, colors and rhythms around him.





























